

CHURCHILL AND THE LEADERS WHO SHAPED HIM


On **Monday**, **15 April 2024**, **at 6 p.m.** in the historic United First Parish Church ("Church of the Presidents"), 1306 Hancock Street, Quincy, Massachusetts, author David Reynolds will speak about his new book and autograph copies. David Reynolds is Emeritus Professor of International History at Cambridge University and a Fellow of the British Academy. He has held visiting positions at Harvard University, Nihon University in Tokyo, and Sciences Po in Paris, and is the writer-presenter of thirteen TV documentaries about 20th century history. His interest in the "special relationship" dates back half a century; indeed, he married into it. His books also include *America, Empire of Liberty: A New History* (2021 edition) and *Island Stories: An Unconventional History of Britain* (2020), both published by Basic Books, New York.

United First Parish Church - "Church of the Presidents"

This historic and still vital church was gathered in 1639 and is the burial place of Presidents John Adams and John Quincy Adams and First Ladies Abigail Adams and Louisa Catherine Adams. It was endowed by John Adams, who specified that it be a "Temple of stone" built of Quincy granite. The present building was completed in 1828 to a design by Alexander Parris and is the congregation's fourth home, replacing the wooden Hancock Meeting House on the same site. This magnificent edifice is considered the finest existing Greek Revival church in New England. It is a National Historic Landmark.

The crypt where the presidents and first ladies lie entombed will be open for guided tours from 5:00 p.m. until 5:50 pm. and for a brief time after completion of the author's presentation.

The church anchors the East side of Hancock-Adams Common, which *Architect Magazine* has lauded as "a celebratory ground that commemorates Quincy's national renown as the birthplace and home of two American presidents. ... The transformation of Hancock Street introduces a new pedestrian promenade and plaza, which serve as an attractive setting for three of the city's most important historic sites: United First Parish Church, Old City Hall and Hancock Cemetery."
